Her love and dedication to the preservation and education of our heritage has benefitted thousands of park visitors over the past twenty-six years. At eight-three, Jo can still be found at Goose Lake Prairie watering plants in the butterfly garden, staffing the Visitor Center, planning for upcoming events and sharing her vast knowledge with park guests. Jo has been and continues to be an invaluable asset to Goose Lake Prairie State Natural Area. The time, dedication, and knowledge Jo has donated over the years makes her a highly recommended candidate for this most deserving award.
